WhatsApp is a free multi-platform Voice over IP (VoIP) messaging service owned by Facebook that allows users to send text messages and voice messages, make voice and video calls, and share images, documents, user locations, etc. You can use WhatsApp from a mobile device, tablet or computer

The **WhatsApp** company was founded in 2009 by Jan Koum and Brian Acton, two former engineers at Yahoo! They have the idea to replace the old SMS (**messaging service**). The software is available for **Android, BlackBerry OS, iOS, Symbian, Windows Phone, Nokia** and is recently available in an application for **Windows 10**, but it can also be used in browsers like WhatsApp Web. The app joined Facebook in 2014, but continues to operate as a standalone app with a focused focus on building a messaging service that is fast and works anywhere in the world.

WhatsApp allows its users to exchange written messages, voice messages and make calls between them. Photo and document files (files) can be sent in written messages. The written message service also allows you to take photos and send them immediately to the contact. Messages and photos can be forwarded to other contacts, who also use WhatsApp. You can also communicate between groups by written messages, for example, you can create a "Family" group, where you will place your wife, your husband, your children and, in this way, you will communicate directly with all of them.

In written conversations, you can express your feelings using emojis. Our messages and calls are protected with end-to-end cryptography, which means that third parties, including WhatsApp, cannot read or listen. Behind every decision is our desire to enable people to communicate without barriers, anywhere in the world.

The contacts in your phone book, if configured with the WhatsApp application, will automatically be added to your WhatsApp contact list. You can see your WhatsApp contact list directly in the WhatsApp application, but you can also see it in your phone book. To access WhatsApp you need an Internet connection, via Wi-Fi or connecting mobile data.

WhatsApp is free to download and can be used on all types of phones. For **iPhone** users there was only one invoice when the app was downloaded. But in December 2012, as a limited offer, it dispensed the flat rate for iOS and was available to download directly from Apple's iTunes, for free.

Little WhatsApp tricks

The first trick is to avoid that some people, whether they are family members, or friends that we have added on WhatsApp, add us to groups, they already know the well-known groups of family or friends, office groups are not only going to silence the group because I have seen many videos where they teach you to silence the group so that they no longer bother you, but here we are going to prevent people from adding you to groups, but beware, that's not all!

Because this trick is cool, they are not going to add you to groups if you don't want to, you are going to have the option that groups or you choose a series of people who cannot add you to groups but obviously this person is not going to know what we are saying. If any of your contacts adds you to a group, then they will notify you that they want to add you to a group and she will tell you that it has not been possible to add them to the group.

After this you have an approximate time of 3 days to decide whether to enter the group or not and nothing more, but also see what the group is about because what if it is something that interests you obviously you are not going to let it go simply because you do not want to be disturbed, if it is something interesting because you click on accept and if the group is eliminated you do not see it and you will never enter the group.

The second trick will help them a lot because there are times when you don't want people to interrupt you or there are times when you have conversations that you don't want your partner to see. For example, let's say one of your friends does not like your girlfriend and she does not want you to talk to him, to avoid problems she will say no because I no longer speak to her and the only thing you are going to do is enter your configuration, go to your WhatsApp application and you remove the log of notifications so no notification will come to you, whoever looks at your phone will not notice if messages are coming from who supposedly she does not want you to write, so avoid headaches.

Since we are talking about how to avoid problems with your partner or with someone who wants to enter your **WhatsApp** or who is interested in what is in it, we have another trick! There is a very recent option which is to block our whatsapp without installing any other application.
